## European Commission: General-Purpose AI Code of Practice Now Available

- The **General-Purpose AI (GPAI) Code of Practice** is a **voluntary compliance tool** developed by independent experts through a multi-stakeholder process **to support the implementation of the EU Artificial Intelligence Act** (AI Act). Its primary aim is to guide providers of general-purpose AI models in aligning with regulatory **transparency, copyright, and systemic risk management** obligations.
- The Code is structured into **three chapters**, each addressing a specific compliance domain: 1) **Transparency** - This chapter introduces a user-oriented Model Documentation Form, facilitating the disclosure of key information to meet the transparency obligations under Article 53 - it is designed to standardize documentation practices and support accountability among GPAI model providers; 2) **Copyright** - Focused on legal compliance, this chapter outlines actionable measures for providers to establish internal policies that ensure adherence to EU copyright

legislation -it addresses the legal challenges posed by AI models trained on large-scale datasets, some of which may include copyrighted content; 3) **Safety and Security** - Applicable specifically to providers of advanced AI models with systemic risk, as defined under Article 55, this chapter prescribes best practices for risk mitigation. It encompasses state-of-the-art safety mechanisms and governance strategies to manage potential harms arising from powerful GPAI systems.
